GUIDELINES AND PROCESSES

IJPP Virtual Special Issues do not have set or limited numbers of contributions. Hence, we encourage all interested scholars to participate.

- All categories of articles (Research, Case Studies, Brief Communication, etc.) will be welcomed in the Special Issue.
- The Guest Editors warmly welcome conversation with authors regarding suitability, direction, or scope of work prior to submission of fully crafted manuscripts.
- For potential inclusion in the Special Issue, contributors must submit manuscripts to
 the Guest Editors and receive approval prior to submission through Elsevier's Editorial
 Manager to ensure that manuscripts fit the scope and vision of the Special Issue.
 Authors submitting manuscripts outside the scope will be strongly encouraged to
 submit their work for inclusion in a general volume of the IJPP.
- All manuscripts will undergo two review processes. The first is initiated by the Guest Editors upon receipt of a manuscript. The second begins when the manuscript is submitted to the IJPP through Editorial Manager. Each manuscript will then undergo, like all manuscripts submitted to the journal, external review and be held to the same standards as all other contributions.
- The Special Issue will be open for new submissions in April 2024 and will remain open until April 30, 2025.
